

Procedure or Surgery Safety Precautions for Patients with a Cardiac Implantable Electronic Device (CIED)

We understand there may be times when you need to get care outside of the Michigan Medicine Health System for different procedures or surgeries. When you do, we will provide information to the other hospital to make sure your cardiac implantable electronic device (CIED) is safe. CIEDs include pacemakers, implantable cardioverter-defibrillators (ICDs), cardiac resynchronization therapy (CRT) devices, and implantable loop recorders (ILRs).

How will my device be monitored for safety?

The hospital where you are having your procedure or surgery will follow their own safety protocols. For your safety, we will provide the outside hospital with the following information:

- A recent CIED report (this will include any recent CIED checks)
- Any recent visit notes from the Electrophysiology Device Clinic

If you have any difficulty scheduling your procedure or surgery at an outside hospital, please contact us so we can help you receive care at Michigan Medicine. You will continue to be followed by our Michigan Medicine Electrophysiology Device Clinic team unless you tell us otherwise.
