## Doctors coming by without an interpreter?

We know doctors have busy schedules, but it's important that they understand your thoughts regarding your care. Please ask that they page 31019 to contact interpreter services so that they can schedule an in-person or virtual (Zoom) sign language interpreter.

It is also your right to ask any provider to come back later with an interpreter. You should not feel pressured to use friends or family as interpreters because the doctors are here now. In fact, the Joint Commission recommends against it.

## **Useful Phrases**

While staying in the hospital, there may be some short interactions with your nurse or other providers where you would rather not wait for an interpreter. In order to help you communicate with your care team, here are some common phrases you can point to, to help them understand your needs.



I want to order a meal.

Where is the food I ordered?



I want to move to the chair.

I want to move to the bed.

I want to be repositioned in bed.



Please inform the doctor that I have some questions.

When will I go home?



I would like some medication to control my pain.

My pain level is:

I don't understand what you are saying. Please come back with an interpreter.

Please come back later. I don't want to talk to anyone/discuss anything right now.

I need to use the bathroom.

I want to shower/bathe.

Please use a clear mask so that I can lipread/understand you better.

I need my dentures.

I need my reading glasses.
