

# Anorectal Manometry (ARM): After Your Test

## What is an anorectal manometry test?

Anorectal manometry measures the tone (strength) in the anal sphincter and rectal muscles. The anal sphincter is made of muscles at the end of the rectum that surround the anus, and the rectal muscles are muscles in the rectum (the lower part of your large intestine where your body stores stool). This test can diagnose problems with defecation (bowel movements). It can measure:

- Resting anal sphincter tone
- Releasing anal sphincter tone
- Squeezing anal sphincter tone
- Muscle coordination
- Expulsion of materials
- Sensation of the rectum

## What side effects should I expect after the test?

You may have some bleeding from your rectum after the test. This is usually only a few drops to a tablespoon.

### When should I call the doctor?

Please call us if you develop any of these symptoms:

- Severe abdominal (stomach) pain
- Fever (a temperature higher than 100.6° F)
- Bleeding more than a few tablespoons of blood from the rectum, or bleeding that won't stop
