


Radiation Oncology: Map, Directions, and Parking



Directions to Radiation Oncology:

Address: 1500 East Medical Center Drive, Ann Arbor, MI 48109

From the north:

- Take US-23 South to the Plymouth Road exit (exit 41).
- Turn right and follow Plymouth Road for about 2 miles.
- Turn left at Maiden Lane.
- As you come to Fuller Road, use the center lane to cross Fuller Road.
 Maiden Lane changes into East Medical Center Drive.

From the south:

- Take US-23 North to the Washtenaw Ave/BR23 exit (exit 37B) toward Ann Arbor.
- Merge onto Washtenaw Avenue and follow it for about 1 mile.
- Turn right at Huron Parkway.
- Turn left at Fuller Road.
- Turn left at Maiden Lane/East Medical Center Drive.

From the east:

- Take I-94 West to US-23 North (exit 180B).
- Take the Washtenaw Ave/BR23 exit (exit 37B) toward Ann Arbor.
- Merge onto Washtenaw Avenue and follow it for about 1 mile.
- Turn right at Huron Parkway.
- Turn left at Fuller Road.
- Turn left at Maiden Lane/East Medical Center Drive.

From the west:

- Take I-94 East to the Ann Arbor Jackson Road exit (exit 172).
- Merge onto Jackson Road (eastbound). Stay on Jackson Road, which becomes Huron Street, and continue for 2.5 miles through downtown Ann Arbor.
- Turn left onto Glen Avenue.
- Turn right at Maiden Lane/East Medical Center Drive.

Parking information:

• Radiation Oncology is located between the Cancer Center and the Emergency Room, across from the helicopter pad. Please park in the parking lot labeled "Radiation Oncology." Go down the sidewalk at the back corner of the lot, which will take you to the entrance.

- The Radiation Oncology department will cover the cost of your parking. We will give you a parking pass when you check in at the desk.
