

Adult Congenital Heart Disease (ACHD) Program

Welcome to the Adult Congenital Heart Disease (ACHD) Program at the Michigan Medicine Frankel Cardiovascular Center. We are here to help adults over age 18 with congenital heart disease. Our program is known as one of the top places for adult congenital heart care. In 2017, the Adult Congenital Heart Association certified us for providing comprehensive, high-quality care.

What services does the ACHD Program offer?

- We use a team-based approach, where we work with other team members within our health system to make sure you receive complete care. This includes:
 - → Heart surgeons who perform surgeries on the heart and large blood vessels if needed
 - Interventional cardiologists who specialize in catheter-based treatment of heart diseases
 - Cardio-obstetrics team members who focus on managing and treating heart disease in pregnant people, ensuring both parent and child health, especially in high-risk pregnancies
 - Pulmonary hypertension team members who provide specialized care and management for patients with high blood pressure in the lungs
 - Electrophysiologists who focus on diagnosing and treating heart rhythm issues
 - Liver disease management specialists, which may include hepatologists or other specialists who manage patients when heart disease affects their liver function

- We provide heart imaging services, including:
 - o Same-day echocardiograms (ultrasounds of the heart)
 - o Adult congenital magnetic resonance imaging (MRI)
- We offer an educational program designed for young adults transitioning to adult healthcare.
