Symptoms of Cytokine Release Syndrome (CRS):

- Fever (100.4F/38C or higher)
- Difficulty breathing
- Chills
- Fast heartbeat
- Dizziness or light-headedness
- Change in blood pressure
- Headache that does not go away and/or nausea

Symptoms of Neurologic Problems:

- Extreme tiredness
- Agitation or feeling restless
- Confusion
- Hallucinations
- Trouble speaking or understanding
- Eyesight changes
- Hearing loss
- Trouble walking
- Tremor or muscle spasms
- Changes in your handwriting
- Numbness and tingling
- Pain in arms, hands, legs, or feet
- Seizures

These are not all the possible symptoms you could experience. Tell your provider if you have any symptoms that bother you or do not go away.
