About Us


The Fetal Diagnosis and Treatment Center (FDTC) offers a complete range of prenatal services, comprehensive diagnostic testing, extensive counseling, and a full spectrum of fetal interventions in a caring environment. We are an integrated part of C.S. Mott Children's Hospital and Von Voigtlander Women's Hospital located together in the same building. This means pediatric specialists for your baby are only steps away.

Our goal is to work with you and your physician during each step of your pregnancy to develop a plan of care up to, and including, the birth of your baby.

Your Visit

Intake Coordinators: Our front desk personnel will be your first contact. They also serve as a resource to facilitate follow-up appointments and expertly coordinate any specialty referrals.

Genetic Counselors: These certified health professionals work to assess your risk or your family's unique risk for inherited conditions. They can discuss genetic testing options and provide support while you choose what is right for your specific situation.

Maternal Fetal Medicine: Our team of maternal fetal medicine physicians has advanced training in areas such as multiple gestations, highrisk maternal health issues and fetal therapy. The hospital is staffed with several of these specialists every day to provide the best care for both mother and baby.

Sonographers: Our ultrasound specialists are all RDMS certified in OB ultrasound and will perform all initial imaging. Their experience and professionalism will put you at ease during the ultrasound exam. A chaperone is available for all sensitive portions of the examination.

Support Care

Social Work: Our social work team provides emotional support as you and your family navigate medical challenges and process complex information during and after your pregnancy.

Stepping Stones: Also called Palliative Care, this specialized team offers an additional layer of support for your family when you're expecting a baby with complex medical needs. They can also assist you with decisions about your baby's care before, during and after delivery.
